

Andrew J. Reid's Will.

State of Georgia | In the name of God — Amen.
 Cobb County | I, Andrew J. Reid, of said State and
 county, do belong to the Army in Virginia,
 and am going to return to said Army in a few days. I am in
 sound mind and disposing memory, and not knowing what
 my happen, and knowing at the same time that life is un-
 known, and death sure, I therefore deem it right and pro-
 per, both as respects my family and myself, that I should
 make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence
 has blessed me. I do therefore make this my last Will
 and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others by me
 before made.

First — I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
 without delay, by my Executor hereinafter named and appointed.

Second — I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved
 wife, Nancy, one child's part, after my just debts are paid.
 The child's part devised and bequeathed to my wife is in full
 enjoyment of her whole right of dower in my estate.

Third — I give and bequeath and devise that my estate,
 both real and personal, be equally divided among my children
 and wife, to wit: wife Nancy, children Mary Jane, Abigail, James

Anderson.

Fourth — I hereby constitute and appoint my father, Na-
 thaniel Reid, Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
 This December 29th 1862. — Word "wife" interlined before signing.

George A Miller's Will.

State of Georgia The last Will and Testament of George A. Miller,
County of Cobb Period County:

In the name of God Amen:
George A Miller, of said county, being in rather feeble health,
and being of sound mind and disposing memory, both in and out of doors,
the mode and manner of the distribution of his worldly estate with
which God has blessed me, do make, ordain and declare this my
last Will and Testament - hereby revoking all former Wills made
by me: Item 1st - I desire to be buried at Monday Church grave
Item 2^d - I desire that all just debts, I may owe at the
time of my death, be paid without delay.
Item 3^d - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Eliza
A Miller, the following property, real and personal, namely: - The
three forty acre lots of land I bought from John Scovitt, numbers
638, 658, and 659, all in the 16th district of the 2^d section, of original
to Blakely now Cobb county, - (these three lots of land were brought
by me and paid for with my said wife's money) - also, the follow-
ing named negro slaves, together with all the future increase of
the female of said negro, namely: Nancy, a woman, aged about
45 years, and her child, a female; Queen, a woman, aged about 23
years, and her girl child, a female; Willis, a man, aged about 20
years; Diana a woman, aged about 18 years; and her boy child
William; Dallas, a boy, aged about 12 years; Morris and Melathri-
son, twin boys, aged about 8 years; Fanny, a girl, aged about 6 years;
Bitty, a woman, aged about 21 years, and her four children, to wit:
Julia, a girl, about 6 years old; Margaret, a girl about 4 years old;
Lucy a girl, about 3 years; and Kamp, a boy, child, about 6 months
old. I also bequeath her the sum of five hundred and twenty
one dollars being the amount of her money in my hands. I also
bequeath her one Buggy and Harness, one chest of Drawers, one Safe,
one Wardrobe, one small mahogany Table, the silver plate that was
brought at Washington City, being the only silver plate in my house -
two featherbeds, Bedsteads and Furniture all the Chinaware in
the house at this time - two Horses, named Job and Arab, and if
both or either of said Horses should die before I do, then they are
to be made up to her in other good Horses or Horses - four Cows
and Calves, and four hogs and their Pigs - said animals, Cows
