

A. A. DuRoi's Will.

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State of Georgia
Cobb County

In the name of God - Amen,
I, Augustus Newton DuRoi, of said State and
county, having volunteered to go into the military
service of the Confederate States, and feeling fully sensible of the pre-
ciousness and uncertainty of human life under all circumstances, and
more especially in the army, deem it right and proper to make
a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has
blessed me, for the benefit of my wife and children.
I do, therefore, make this my last Will and Testament:-

Item 1. - I give and bequeath my entire estate, consist-
ing of about three hundred acres of land, a negro woman named
Sulea, and her three children, and other property, (after paying
all just debts against me at my death) to my beloved wife,
Sarah Ann, for and during her life or widowhood, to be kept
together and prudently used for the support and maintenance
of my said wife and my children, and the education of
said children, as liberally as the circumstances of said es-
tate will prudently admit of.

Item 2. - Upon the marriage of my said wife should
she ever marry, I desire my entire estate to be equally divided
between her and my children, share and share alike, she taking
one share, and at her death, I desire that share to be equally
divided among my children.

Item 3. - Should my widow never marry, I wish said
property to remain together and used for the purposes designated
in item first, till her death, when I desire that it shall be equal-
ly divided between my said children and their representa-
tives, taking per stripes.

Item 4. - Should my

in her and my children, I desire that share ^{equally},
share, and at her death, I desire that share ^{equally},
divided among my children.

Item 3 - Should my widow never marry, I wish said
property to remain together and used for the purposes designated
in item first, till her death, when I desire that it shall be equa-
ly divided between my said children and their representa-
tives, taking per stripes.

Item 4 - The perishable property belonging to my estate,
not necessary for the support of my family, I desire sold, and
the proceeds, after paying expenses of probate, etc. applied to the
support of my family.

Item 5 - I wish my executor to act as trustee for my chil-
dren, to see that the ^{proceeds} of this will are carried out, and I
give him power whenever he and my widow may think best,
by leave of the Superior Court, to sell, publicly or privately, or ex-
change any part of my said estate, and invest the proceeds
to be kept for division as above.

Item 6 - I constitute and appoint my father, Benjamin
D. DuPre, my Executor.

Item 7 - Should any change be made in said property, as
provided for, in item fifth, I desire a statement thereof to be made
to the Superior Court, and put upon record, Decr 22, 1862.
