Will

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I Stephen D Cowan of said State and County
being of sound and disposing mind and memory
do hereby give bequeath and testament
to my son and his three children to my wife Mary Ellen
and Clara Jane Cowan my daughter Mary Ellen
the dwelling the dwelling house tract of land
and all the out buildings house on which I
own and twenty acres of land and about three
hundred and sixty acres of the lot adjoining
the Dotts lot, and I also give them all the work
of which I may be possessed at the time of my death
also my wogons and Buggies and other kinds of
what grain of every kind and farming utensils
then on hand and household and kitchen
utensils.

Second. I devise and bequeath to my daughter
L. Cowan and Cora E. Lelley the Boked lands consist
of about one hundred and fourteen acres including
acres of M^{rs} Tar form

Third. I desire that my body shall be decently
buried according to Christian custom, and the expenses
of my other debts if any be paid, and
the expenses of my money and notes if any to be equally
divided among all my living children and the heirs
of those who are dead

Fourth. I give and bequeath to my son Henry
Cowan about eighty five acres being the two lots
known as The Jolly lot and the other adjoins the
lot of W. A. Williamson. I also appoint Jas. W. M. Mullen
executor to carry out this my last will and be
testament this Jan 1st 1894
