STATE OF GEORGIA, CORN COUNTY.

I, Eliza E. Allen of said State and county being of sound and disposing mind and memory do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament revoking any and all other wills that I may have made.

ITEM I. I will and bequeath that anything I may own at the time of my death be sold.

ITEM II. I intend making oral disposition of my personal belongings such as household and kitchen furniture, sewing machine &c and they are not included in this will.

ITEM III.

I will that at my death all the property I may have, both real and personal, except such household articles as are included in item two of this will go to and be the property of my son Boyd Allen without reserve or restrictions of any kind to be his individually. This item is to include the one fifth interest that I inherit from my deceased husband J.O. Allen and which I now own and is also to include any amount that may be allowed me as dower or years support from my said husbands estate. The intention of this instrument is to give to him absolutely all the property that I may die owning in any way except such articles as are in the house that I shall dispose of otherwise.

ITEM IV. I nominate and appoint my brother N.W.B. Dodson Executor of this will and direct that he be relieved from giving any bond or that he make any returns to any court.

(By way of explanation I state that the reason I give all I have to Boyd is not because I love my other children less, but because of his afflictions, he being blind I feel that he should have the advantage of the other children who are no so afflicted.)
