Georgia In the name of God. Amen. I John F. Lommeau of said County, being in full health, but of sound and disposing mind, do make & publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby making this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me previous to this: I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent & Christian like manner by the side of my former wife.

2nd Will: I desire and direct that all my just debts, be paid, by my Executors herein after named. If there should be no fund on hand to pay them, my said Executors may dispose of a sufficient quantity of Household Furniture as may be necessary to pay the same.

3rd Will becoming Trustee for my children in 1859. David Arctic and David Frisia become my securities - and to secure them I give them a Mortgage on my House lot in Town, and my plantation three miles of Marietta - I much desire that they be discharged from said security slip & let the said property Mortgaged stand in their stead; I have recently made a return to the Ordinary showing the condition of said trust property; Upon an examination & final adjustment of said return it should appear that my portion of the Corpus of said trust funds, had been expended improperly & there should be a deficit whatever that may be, I desire that so much of my Estate be taken to make it good - after this is satisfactorily adjusted, then I desire I bequeath the remainder of my Estate to my dear wife & daughter Virginia O; This residue of my Estate I mean to embrace all the remainder of my real & personal estate together with all my House & Kitchen furniture except the articles herein after specially bequeathed.

Special Legacies

1st I give and bequeath to my beloved wife my own gold watch
 after my death to be distributed in the parlor among the dead between
 of Celicia.
 2^d I give to my daughter Eliza Gray her mother gold Watch - also
 the portrait of her mother.
 3^r I give to my daughter Julia L. her own line of copy of my books
 in my library, also the picture of her Grand Father - also
 father politicians in the Chamber.
 4^t I give to my daughter Hannah A. the portrait of my son & mother
 in the Studio.
 5^s I give to my dear little daughter Virginia C. my silver Hatch
 & a small portion of her father in parlor.
 4^t I desire that no apprenticeship be had of remaining Estate, that
 may be left after payment of my debts, - but that the same
 remainder be taken charge by my Executors & turned over just
 as it is found. And should it be necessary to sell any of the
 property, that it be done without any order of Court.
 5^s I hereby appoint my dear friends Dr. A. Simpson and
 Dr. G. Stewart, my Executors, to carry out the instructions of
 this my Will.
