Rev. John F. Lannear's Will

Georgia In the name of God - Amen
I, John F. Lannear of said County, being in
perfect health, full of sound and disposing mind, deem right
and proper, that I should make a disposition of the property
which I own, and kind Providence has blessed me, do
thereby make this my last Will and Testament, hereby
revoking all others heretofore made by me.

I desire and direct, that my body be buried in a
decent & Christian like manner by the side of my
former Wife
2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts be
paid by my Executors herein after named
If there should be no funds on hand to pay them, my said
Executors may dispose of a sufficient quantity of Household Furniture
as may be necessary to pay the same.

3rd I am becoming Trustee for my children in 1859. David A. and
David Ardis become my securities - and to secure them
I give them a Mortgage on my House & lot in Town, and my Plantation
three miles of Marietta - I much desire that they be discharged from
said security, ship & let the said property mortgaged stand in their
stead; I have recently made a return to the Ordinary, showing
the Condition of said trust property; Upon an examination & final
adjustment of said return it should appear that my portion of
the Corpus of said trust funds had been expended improperly
& there should be a deficit whatever that may be, I desire that
so much of my Estate be taken to make it good - after this
is satisfactorily adjusted, then I desire & bequeath the remainder
of my Estate to my dear Wife & daughter Virginia O; This residue
of my Estate I mean to embrace all the remainder of my real Estate
together with all my House & Kitchen furniture except the articles herein
after specially bequeathed.

Special Legacies

1st I give and bequeath to my beloved wife my own gold watch
also my large portrait in the parlor also the death bed room
of Edwin.

2nd I give to my daughter Eliza Gray her mother's gold watch - also
the portrait of her mother.

3rd I give to my daughter Julia L. her own share of any of my property
in my library, also the picture of her grand father - also the
father's portraits in the chamber.

4th I give to my daughter Hannah W. the portrait of my father & mother
in the study.

5th I give to my dear little daughter Virginia C. my silver watch
& the small portrait of her father in parlor.

4th I direct that no appointment be had of remaining Estate, that
maybe left after payment of my debts - but that the same
remainder be taken charge of by my Executors & turned over just
as it is found. - And should it be necessary to sell any of the
property, that it be done without any order of Court.

5th I hereby appoint my dear friends, A. N. Simpson, and
Dr. D. B. Stewart, my Executors, to carry out the instructions of
this my Will.
