John Robinsons Will.

State of Georgia
Cobb County

In the name of God - Amen,
I, John Robinson, of said State and county,
being of sound mind and memory, knowing that
I must shortly depart this life, deem it right and proper, both as
respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition
of the property which a kind Providence has blessed me. I do there-
fore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and
annulling all others by me heretofore made.

First - I desire and direct that all my just debts be
paid, without delay, by my Executor hereinafter named and ap-
pointed.

Second - I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved
wife, Theresa, one half of my household furniture and all my
kitchen furniture, to her own proper use and benefit, with full
power to dispose of the same by Will or otherwise, as she may deem
proper.

Third - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, for and
during her natural life or widowhood, one lot of Land, lying and
being in the nineteenth district and second section of Cobb County,
numbering four hundred and sixty three; also the west half of Lot

of land amounting five hundred, lying and being in the first and second section of Cobb County; also my Moore and my cows and hogs and farming tools, and all my personal property not hereinbefore mentioned, my son and daughter, my meat and my wheat, also the one half of my household furniture. The property devised and bequeathed in the above said will, my wife is in full enjoyment of her whole right of administration of my estate.

Fourth - All my property mentioned in the first and second section of this Will, given to my wife, Theresa, during her natural life, and widowhood, is to be divided equally between my children, in her estate when is over.

Fifth - I hereby constitute and appoint my friend, John Robinson, Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

Signed, sealed, declared and published by John Robinson, as his last Will and Testament in the presence of us, the undersigned, who subscribed our names hereto, in the presence of said Testator, at his special instance and request, and in the presence of each other, this May 15, 1862.
