State of Georgia This Indenture made this Sixth day of April
Cobb County 3 in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred
and fifty four between Martha Williamson of the County and State aforesaid
of the one part and my Sister four Orphan Children of the State of South
Carolina of the other part, to wit, Greenberry Taylor, Thomas Taylor, Jr.
Taylor and Martha Jane Taylor) of the other part. Witnessed
that I do this day give and bequeath unto the above named Orphan
children, all the goods and chattels, lands, and tenements, and all money,
after my death; consisting of one Lot of Land, lying and being in the
Seventeenth District, Second Section of said County containing Forty
acres, more or less, to Six Hundred and four (604) which they are to
have and to hold the above named property and moneys after

had left home & come
back and at first I
told all the time
