Will (Common Form)

I John Moulder of said State and County
being of sound and disposing mind and memory
do make this my last will and Testament

I give bequeath and devise to my wife Eliza Moulder the following
property to wit, my house and lot in the town of Washington the
widowhood but should the money again said
property including household and furniture
Moulder and John Bell Rowson and two children Eliza
each during the life time of my wife and at her death
what is left of her third to be equally divided between my
son and daughter above named I also devise that my
blacksmith shop shall belong as above to my wife
during her widowhood but at her marriage or death my
little to vest fully in my son William Moulder and that
my wife control and over my house and lot adjoining
the Emanuel place the same as she does the house and
lot in which I live and at her marriage or death that
it be divided as that house and lot is to be divided
and I request that after my death that my body be
decently buried according to Christian custom and
that all my just debts if any be paid out of my estate
before any other division of the property is made
I hereby appoint my son William Moulder executor
of this my last will and Testament this the 11th day of March 1899
