Second - I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife, Mary Ann, one lot of land number two hundred and twenty eight, in the 19th district and 2^d section of Cobb county, containing forty acres, with all the rights, members and appurtenances to said lot of land in anywise belonging, free from all charge and limitation whatever, to her own use, benefit and behoof forever, with full power to dispose of the same by Will or otherwise as she may deem proper. I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife, in the same unserved manner, the residue of my property, both real and personal, wherever and whatever it may be.

Third, - I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Mary Ann, the Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
