Jan 2nd 1800 I beg leave to my dear Father Obed Kemp all of
the increase real and personal property of the heirs of my
dear wife's death, should he take one probable share
of both of us while we live and of his sister my
daughter Sally Kemp, while she lives, for my wife's
debt and give me and my wife a cent annual
