Georgia In the name of God - Amen.
 Fulton County I, William Lemon of the County of Fulton
 & State of Georgia, being of sound and disposing mind, memory
 & being desirous to settle my worldly affairs which I here
 strength, solids, do make & publish this my last Will & testament
 hereby revoking all wills by me at any time heretofore made.
 Item 1st I desire that all my just debt be first paid as soon as
 possible.

2nd I desire & will that all my property, after the payment of
 my just debts, shall belong equally to my wife Caroline Lemon & to my son
 William Lemon, & to my unborn child by my wife Caroline, provided
 said child shall come to maturity, & become capable of inheritance

3rd I desire & will that Ezekiel D Hall shall be Executor of my wife
 Caroline Lemon Executor of this my last Will & testament
 In witness whereof I the said William Lemon have to this my
 Will, consisting of one sheet of paper set my hand and seal
