I am, and have for many years been
living, should make a disposition of the
property with which a kind Providence has
blessed me, I therefore make this my last
will and Testament hereby revoking and
annulling all others heretofore made by me.
Item first: I desire and direct that my
body be buried in a decent and Christian
like manner suitable to my circumstances and
condition. My soul shall return to God
who gave it.

Item second: I desire and direct that my
just debts be paid with out delay by
my executors herein after named and
appointed.

Item third: I give bequeath and devise
to my beloved friend Cassa Ann Cato
my entire and her children whom she now
has to wit: John W Cato, Henry Cato,
and Ollie Cato, my entire Estate,
consisting of two good oxen and carts,
my entire stock of hogs, there being
about seventy five head to gether with
what money I may have after paying
all my just debts; also my corn, wheat
on field Potatoes and Peas with my
farming implements house hold and
kitchen furniture &c together with
what ever right and possession I have
assumed to the place upon which I
now live. My rifle gun is to be
taken care of for and finally
given to the said Henry Cato when

he becomes capable of managing the same for
himself. The stock Cattle were always the
property of the said Cassa Ann
my reason for thus disposing of my effects
is to enable the said Cassa Ann who
helped me to make what I possess, and
who has befriended, comforted and helped
me in my old age, to support, raise
and educate my children as best she
may and I therefore trust my now
grown up and settled children, knowing
the relationship that has long existed
between the said Cassa Ann, her children
and myself, will most charitably concur
with me in the disposal I do hereby
make.

Item fourth: I constitute and appoint
my worthy friend John Cato, execut-
or to this my last will and Testament
this January 21st 1874.
