I J. J. Hill of said County being of advan-
 ced age but of sound and disposing mind
 and memory, knowing that I must shortly
 depart this life deem it right and proper
 that as respects myself and my family
 that I should make a disposition of
 the property with which, a kind providence
 has blessed me, I therefore make this
 my last will and testament hereby re-
 voking and annulling all others by me
 heretofore made

First

I desire that all my lawful debts be
 paid except burial expenses included

Secondly

I then desire that the balance of my
 property be equally divided among my
 lawful heirs, with the exception of the
 widow of my brother, John Hill deceased
 Adaline Hill and her child. It is my
 desire that they, the said Adaline and child,
 nor or child inherit no part of my real
 or personal property whatever.

Thirdly

I hereby constitute and appoint my friend
 John Russell executor of this my last will
 and testament. This 28th Sept 1880.
