Secondly I desire my said will to be proved and published in the presence of the undersigned who subscribe our names here in the presence of said testator at the special instance and request and in the presence of each other this December 11-1898

Thirdly I give and bequeath and desire to my beloved wife Sarah Douglas lot of Land No 371 Sherburne and twenty one also No 372 Sherburne and twenty two all in the Sixth District of originally Appleton now Coffee County containing four hundred and thirty acres more or less each with all the rights and appurtenances to said lots of Land in and to be belonging free from all charges and limitation whatsoever to her and proper use benefit and behoof forever with full power to dispose of the same by will or otherwise as she may deem proper I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife in the same unserved manner the farming utensils used on and belonging to the farm on said lots of Land and one horse such horse as she may choose to keep on the place and little

head of cattle one yoke of oxen and cart and the entire stock of Hogs and fifty head of Sheep and all my household and kitchen furniture all without Limitation or reserve also one Buggy and Harness one Jersey Wagon and Sewing Machine all without Limitation or reserve

Fourth I now mention my children Mary and Fannie and Rebecca and Elizabeth that I have given one hundred Dollars each I also desire that Dorcas and Minna have one hundred Dollars each after that the remainder of my property not yet mentioned to be divided equally among or between my children as my Executors may deem proper or think best.

Fifth I hereby constitute and appoint my friends Lawrence Kewbum and Willis Kewbum when they come of age to have full power to assist Lawrence Kewbum as Executors of this my last will and testimony Robert Douglas.
