Item 1st I Give and bequeath to my Eldest Son
William T. and Benjamin A. Northern four
negro servants I have a man, Mariah a woman
Chancy a woman and Sam, a boy said
negroes to be Equally divided between my
said Eldest Son, William T. & Benjamin A.
Share and share alike, also I Give to my
said two Eldest Son, in the manner above
specified two lots of land (drawn by my
wife Rebecca Northern of said lots lying
in Gilmer County. & the other in Paulding
County, And I further give in addition to
the above bequests to Benjamin A. Northern
one feather bed & furniture to make up
his portion Equal to William T. Northern's
portion, he the said William T. having
already received one feather bed and furni-
-ture, the said William T. & Benjamin A.
to receive the above specified bequests
no more,

Item 2nd I Give and bequeath to my Son
Jessey Felix Collier one negro boy named
Monroe, one hundred dollars in money
one feather bed and furniture
I Witnessed at

five hundred, also one hundred dollars in money, one feather bed & furniture, also all the bed furniture now in my house made by my said daughter Elizabeth Ann.

Item 4th. I Give and bequeath to my Son Benjamin T. Collin one negro girl named Amanda, he the said Benjamin T. Collin having already received one Horse Saddle & bridle, feather bed & furniture and one hundred dollars in money.

Item 5th. I Give and bequeath to my two Sons Harrison H. and John H. Collin each one feather bed and furniture thing the said Harrison H. & John H. having already received from me, each a negro and one hundred dollars equal to the share given & bequeathed to my Children above. I Give and bequeath also my Son William E. Collin, my daughter Inna L. Colbert. and Sarah J. Jackson each received already one negro. Horse Saddle & bridle and one hundred dollars in money equal to the bequests above made & specified in the Second, Third and fourth Items of this will.

Item 6th. After my funeral expenses and all my other just debts are paid, it is my will and desire that the balance of my estate both real & personal or of whatever it may consist not already bequeathed or given away, to be Equally divided share & share alike among my Children, to-wit, my Sons Benjamin T. Collin, John H. Collin,

Sarah Jackson deceased my dear mother
grand children to have only so much of
my estate in this life the other mentioned by
them deceased mother would have been entitled
unto, according to the provisions thereof were
she alive

Item 7th I hereby constitute and
appoint my sons Harrison H Collier and John
H Collier Executors of this my last will &
testaments this June 17th 1848

said will bequeathed, the balance
said bequeath to said Benjamin A. to
remain as in said will bequeathed.

Secondly I alter and revoke so much of
the sixth item of my will as gives to
my son William E. Collier an equal
share of whatever property may be left
as contemplated in said sixth item
and I hereby give to my said son
William E. Collier five dollars no more
and I further decern & direct that the
said share contemplated to be given and
bequeathed to him my said son William
E. Collier to go to and visit in his two sons
namely Erasmus Collier and George
H. Collier share & share alike: And I
do hereby constitute and appoint my son
Harrison H. Collier and John H. Collier
trustees of the property bequeathed and
given to my said grand children
Erasmus Collier & George H. Collier by the
Codicil - February 9th 1856
