Crawford County Will Book A (1835-1852)

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Item I do give and bequeath unto my
beloved wife Sumner Culppepper all
my Estate both real and personal during
her natural life, after paying all my
just debts, with the following exceptions

To wit

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto Perry
Wesley Culppepper (so called) five dollars
out of any money belonging to my Estate
the said Perry Wesley Culppepper being
the son of Elmira Culppepper the wife
of my only son Isaac Culppepper deceased
& born in wedlock

Item 2nd After the death of my wife Sumner
Culppepper I reserve and bequeath two
hundred dollars to be appropriated to
the support of my family in the year

and substantial walk around our grave
I am etc. I request that my beloved wife
Annina Culpepper and I do hereby leave
her my Executors. Given under my hand
and seal. This the nineteenth day of August
in the year our lord. One thousand Eight
hundred and forty five
