

Testament, hereby annulling all others heretofore made.

First. I commit the keeping of my soul into the hands of the Lord Jesus, and my body to burial, at the discretion of my friends and, insofar, in mass work of time and land, at the expense of turning up Dollars on Memorial Day touching such property as Joseph I dispose of, the same as follows:

I give to my daughter Mary Ellen who lives in Ohio, fifty Dollars each to Nathaniel Cotton who was once my daughter in law fifty Dollars.

3rd I give and bequeath to my grand son Mr. M. Saffey Six Thousand Dollars in good notes, which money is to be put to interest, until the said have come to their full age, and which shall then be paid to them, together with whatever interest shall have accrued. I wish them to be liberally educated, and such of the moneys to be laid out in their education.

4th I give and bequeath to my son Peter Saffey all my lands in Worcester County and a lot of up land in New County to him and his heirs forever— also the following negroes, Peter a man about twenty three years of age, Henry a boy about twenty years of age, Ned a man about 24 years of age, together with a woman named Calpurnia and their child, I also bequeath to my son the said Peter all the other property I own of every description and kind.

I appoint Mr. Rev. Osborn Rogers and Abraham Roberts my Executors and Testamentary Executors, to my grandson Mr. M. Saffey to carry into effect the provisions of this my last will and Testament.
