after appointed as I am unwilling my

James Allman now lives and I also
bequeath at her death that all of my
estate both real and personal be
divided between all of my living nephews
Ezra Hall & Simon Hall which for
some cause known to myself I
give each of them five dollars, each
of them

4th I hereby constitute and
appoint my beloved wife Lucy Quincy
and my worthy friend James
Allman my executor of this my
last will & testament
this 31st of March 1857
