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Andrew Crawford State of Georgia I am the twenty ninth  
legitimate son of John Crawford - In the name of  
God Amen I do hereby certify that the County of Crawford  
State of Georgia being found in body but of sound  
mind and memory in the said Order and this my last  
Will and Testament in form as follows,  
I do hereby wish my executor hereafter to be named, to  
pay all my Just debts,  
Item And I wish my executor to sell at public auction  
before the Court houses door in the County of Crawford  
and State of Georgia my negro and household  
in that State, on a credit of twelve months  
approved security - I wish my stock, land  
all perishable estate, sold for cash  
in hand by my executor

kins the said Jeremiah Drow, as soon as his  
will is proved, on a credit of twelve months  
good bonds and security given by the executor  
and the proceeds to be paid over to my  
Executor hereafter to be named, for the benefit  
of all my children viz Elizabeth Drow  
James Drow, John Drow, Winifred Drow  
& Wm Drow & Susan all Drow I desire my  
Ex<sup>r</sup> hereafter named to give my children a  
common education

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I desire that each one of my children  
shall have allotted to them an equal  
portion of all my estate as they may on  
become of age

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I hereby nominate and appoint my  
friend Charly H Walker of the County  
of Crawford & State of Georgia, Executor  
of my last will and testament

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Item 6<sup>th</sup> It is my particular desire that my Executor  
Charly H Walker will take all my children  
to him with him & I desire him to treat them  
as his own so far as circumstances will admit  
Except Susan all Drow & I desire that Mrs  
Mary Ann Harris may have the privilege of  
keeping if she wishes
