 twenty one year I wish each of them to have a good horse each
 after the death or marriage of my wife I wish all my
 property both real and personal to be sold and the money to
 be equally divided between all my children John Allen,
 Benjamin, Henry, Alexander John et al Absalom B., Mary Ann,
 Elizabeth, David and Rebecca - I appoint my wife
 Elizabeth Henry and my son Absalom B. and son of Henry
 Executors on this my last will and Testament.

of Crawford County, Georgia, as admitted to Record

Georgia } To all whom these shall come

In the name of God Amen - I make this my
last Will & Testament In the first place
I will & bequeath to my beloved Wife
J. Morris the plantation I now live on except
fifty acres to be taken of the north side &
all the negroes not a greedy given of together
with the stock of all kind consisting of
horses cattle & hogs the plantation tools
Household ^{furniture} furniture to have & dispose of & also
for to the ^{second} district until paid to George A
Bainbury this I leave as my last will &
testament & I appoint John McBride &
John Cowan to execute this my last will
& testament Given under my hand & seal this
12th day October 1826
