First It is my will & desire that all my estate both real
& personal shall be sold at public auction or soon
after my decease as practicable on a writ of habere
Mortgage first giving thirty days notice of the time
& place of such sale and that all my just debts be paid
thereof I give and bequeath to my wife and daughter Patsy
the sum of twenty five hundred dollars each during
their joint lives and then the survivor of them to
take the whole and enjoy the same absolutely.

Third I give & bequeath to my son Henry the sum of twenty
five hundred dollars to be paid him out of the
proceeds of my estate.

Fourth After the payment of my just debts & the said
legacies & the residue of my estate to be equally divided between my ~~four~~
wife and my four children (to wit) Mary Harris Joseph
Henry & Patsy with this limitation that my wife
Mary Harris and Patsy shall enjoy their equal
share of the balance of my estate mentioned in this
clause during their joint lives and then the same
to vest in the survivor of them absolutely except
the share of Mary Harris which is limited to her sole
and separate use and her children In testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this 13th day of November 1846.
