the property owned or possessed by her in her own
right at the time of our marriage or prior
thereto, also a negro man named Huger
a negro girl named Rosette and a negro girl
named Harriet now in the possession of my
brother George Russell Hunter of Knoxville
Georgia, also all debts due me by Isaac man
and such other persons as the may desire.

Item 3. I give bequeath and devise to my sister
Martha Hitchcock in trust for her daughter
until she marries or becomes of age, a negro
woman Sarah and her three children Glen
Peter and Charles,

Item 4th I give bequeath and devise to Marianne
Russell Spencer Hunter daughter of my
brother George R Hunter the real estate
and lands owned by me or in which I am
interested lying & being in the County of
Crawford and State of Georgia being the
undivided half of two lots of land in the
possession of the said G R Hunter
and I do further give devise and bequeath
to the said Marianne Russell Spencer Hunter
my niece as aforesaid the following namely
a negro woman a son and a son son Wiley

personal & hereby directed
to her, as to debts and belong to any
or children of the said George B Hunter
living share and share alike
Thus I give and bequeath to Dr Charles M
Hitchcock Re. 5 army all property real and
personal I may die possessed of not hitherto
divided

I hereby constitute and appoint Dr
Charles M Hitchcock and my brother George
B Hunter Executors to this my last will
and testament
