I do give unto my wife Nancy Wright. During her
 natural life, her heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, on which
 the above said land is situated, and which is not known by
 No thirty one even the other by fifty two both formerly
 lying in the first district of Gloucester County, Maryland
 I do give her all my negroes namely Nathan age fifty
 or sixty & Henry age twenty seven & Emaline age twenty
 seven & John age about twenty and Alfred about
 twelve years old and Harriett about eight years
 old and Mitt about six years old and doublets
 about four years old and Leander about two or three
 months old & I do give her my wife Nancy Wright all
 my negroes and that is one and my son's were all
 my sheep and sheep and all my horses and
 my plantation and my mill and my washing mill
 and my place and all my plantation and all my
 household things of bone and fodder wheat and oats
 and I do for the wife and her term that I have for
 the children of my son William Wright

...the witnesses to Wright's will...
that Wright do give him at my wife's death one
one acre one fourth acres of land off of the land
of Lot M sixty two and one eighth Boy known by
Wright and do want at my wife's death for my purpose
that I want make a special will of to be equally divided
between my daughters and Mrs. Abigail Adams and
and Eliza Bays more and Mary Walpole and their
heirs of said Bays and my own children that I
do I want decrease nearly Mary Ann and Abigail
I do and Mrs. P. R. S. Wright to be equally divided
between them with the exception of my land that
is the balance that I want make a special will to
be given to my daughters and their children
and to their heirs and I do not only and the name
of them in my will and I do with
my children... Eliza Bays more and
Barnard Walpole five dollars each of them and
that is to be paid out of my estate and so
therefore I want my wife to pay all my debts and to
have my estate that is made this year and to make
a sufficiency of my property to pay my debts and at
my death will such as she can spare must come
withinly without delay and I do appoint as my
executors to my last will and testament my wife
Fanny Wright and William Knatchfield and their
heirs I have here made at my house and office
my last will the day of February 1842 by
William Smith

other Wills by me made and the following
Item 1. I will and bequeath unto my father and mother
Should they both be living all my Estate Whither
real personal or any other denomination whatsoever
in this will not hereafter disposed of and my father
will and bequeath unto my Brother George all his three
children after my Mothers death all my slaves not hereafter
disposed of hereof
Item 2. I Will and bequeath unto my Brother Thomas I shall
a negro man by the name of Bristol and also 1200
dollars in money due me from my brother William
shall for Land sold here
Item 3. I Will and bequeath unto my brother William Hall
the balance of my Land
Item 4. I Will and bequeath unto Elizabeth Keaster a negro
man named Peter and a kids named Lucith
other and in the two slaves as shall be of the value
of 100 dollars and in the kids as shall be of the value
