for nine (9) years in the holy bonds of  
matrimony Nancy Ammons the  
provision she has on hand or to be  
brought to her her one year I give and  
bequeath to my wife her bed and trunks  
and clothing and such other articles belonging  
to her two chests one table three chairs the  
four square cooking ware kettles and  
Cupboard and dispose of as she wishes  
Third I give and bequeath to my  
five eldest children the amount of one  
dollar each to wit Isaac Ammons Sarah  
Ann Ammons Hannah Ammons Sarah  
Nancy Black to be paid as soon  
as they are of legal age

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I have made by will to  
my youngest son Stephen summing  
three hundred dollars in a promissory  
note due the twenty fifth of December  
next and made payable to see &  
signed by Joel Walker of Blount  
County

Item fifth I think that my four or five  
that all my four should equally parts each  
other in the balance of my estate hoping  
they will abide this will as it is the  
burden of me myself and my only  
dear as to this this world fourth item  
contained after all expenses that has or  
may occur be paid. my four and to  
share equally in last ~~item~~ ~~fifth~~ item  
Item sixth I in the last place appoints

confidence as a friend and Christian  
I hope my children will meet and  
all abide this will & settle friendly. so  
as to any expenses that might incur from  
confusion I also hope they will live right  
in the present life and meet me in
