her life.

Also my wife shall have and good support from
my effects.

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Also other effects which may be at hand to be
taken in charge by executor or executors for
distribution to legal heirs.

I hereby name Elizabeth Patterson my wife,
to be Executor of this will without bond and
Wm J. Townsend her advisor.

After the death of my wife my estate to be ad-
ministered out by administrators for distribution among
