

Last Will of W. H. Hillman

State of Georgia

Dade County

I, W. H. Hillman of said state and County, being of sound mind make this my last will and testament.

First

I desire that my ~~estate~~ ^{executors} hereinafter named shall as soon practicable after my death pay all my just debts.

'Second'

I give to my wife Lucia all my property, personal or mixed for the sole benefit of herself and my children. I desire and direct that after my death my executor hereafter named shall take full charge and complete control of all my said property which I may own at my death that she manage the same to the best advantage to herself and my said children.

Third

I desire ^{and direct} that my said executor shall keep all the real estate of mine until ^{or twenty} years of my said wife's death. No part shall the same be sold or in anywise encumbered and that when my said youngest child arrives at the age of twenty and years that my said lands shall be sold or divided equally among my said children, if sold the proceeds of said to be equally divided among my said children.

Fourth

I appoint my wife Lucia Hillman as the sole executrix of this my last will and that she be authorized to sue or be sued, to collect my money or other things belonging to me and to sign such receipts as found necessary.

Fifth

I desire and direct that my said executrix ^{from} making bond as required by law in making any return whatsoever to the Court of Ordinary ^{or} ~~or~~ ^{in the} ~~of~~ ^{having} jurisdiction of the estate of deceased persons.

Sixth

I desire and direct that my said executor handle and use all the proceeds, rents and profits of my said lands as she thinks best for

benefit of himself and my said children without the aid or direction of any court.
