

First Will of W.H. Hilliard

State of Georgia,

Dade County,

I, W.H. Hilliard of said state and County, being of sound mind make this my last will and testament.

First

I desire that my said wife, my executrix hereinafter named shall as soon practicable after my death pay all my just debts.

Second

I give to my wife Lucia all, my property, personal or mixed for the sole benefit of herself and my children.

I desire and direct that after my death my execatrix hereinafter named shall take full charge and complete control of all my said property which I may own at my death that she manage the same to their best advantage to herself and my said children.

Third

I desire that my said executrix shall keep all the real estate of my wife Lucia in trust for twenty years. No event shall the said be sold or in anywise diminished and that when my said youngest child arrives at the age of twenty one years that my said lands shall be sold or divided equally among my said children, if sold the proceeds of said to be equally divided among my said children.

Fourth

I appoint my wife Lucia Hilliard as the sole attorney of this my last will and that she be authorized to sue or be sued, to collect my money or other things belonging to me and to sign with me either as joint or singly.

Fifth

I desire and direct that my said executrix get and making bond as required by law, &c., making any return whatsoever to the Court of Ordinary, or other court having jurisdiction of the estate of deceased persons.

Sixth

I desire and direct that my said executrix handle and use all the products, rents and profits of my said lands as she thinks best for

benefit of herself and my said children without the
aid or direction of any court.
