the law. Charge me, & that I will make
me and perfect inventory of all such
goods & chattels & help. Son. God.
Signed before me on
open court, this August 1, 1854. Thomas J. Strickland

Whereupon it is named, that said will be
admitted to record, as the last will &
testament of Ruben Strickland deceased,
and that letters testamentary be issued theron
to Thomas J. Strickland, one of the executors
in said will named, he being first taken
the oath of qualifications.

Georgia X The Isaac A. Miller
Decatur County, George M. Grinday and
Tabitha Smith were
present on Sunday the second day of
October eighteen hundred and fifty
nine at the residence of Archibald S.
Smith a married man. Being in
perfect possession of his mental
faculties and not dying until the

the twenty eighth day of the month
named he called upon me to be his subscriber
and take notice of what he was about
to say - That he wished to make a
memorandum will which reads as
follows. That he wished his debts
be paid and his negroes kept and han-
dled out for the use of his wife Tabitha
Archibald Smith and his children by
her to wit Montague A. Smith William
G. Smith and John Smith until said
children were all raised and that they
should have his entire estate both
real and personal. That he appointed
Green W. Clay his Executor and
wished him take charge of his prop-
erty.

Georgia In person appeared
Decatur County before me Joseph
Law Ordinary of said
County Isaac D. Wilkes George W. Sunday
and Tabitha Smith who being duly
sworn say that this paper contained
the last request and a verbal dispos-
ition of the real and personal prop-
erty of Archibald A. Smith late of said
County deceased and is just and true
in all its parts.
