In the name of God Amen. I Bennett Weeks of the
State of Georgia, Decatur County, being weak in body
but sound in mind do make this my last will
and testament (to wit)

1st I give and bequeath unto my Mother Mary Cobb
one negro woman named Nancy one other
woman named Elizabeth one other woman named
Sib one girl named Sarah one boy named Isaac
one other boy named Charles also my oxen and
wagon all the provisions, all the house hold and kit-
chen furniture my entire stock of hogs two horses
and all the promissary notes that I hold against her
during her natural life. And upon her death it is
it is my will and desire that the above named
negro boy Isaac and my young man be given to
my half brother Rubin Cobb and that the above nam-
ed negro girl Sarah be given to my half Sister
Francis Cobb and the balance of the above named ne-
groes be equally divided between Levir Weeks and
Delia Johnson. 2nd I give and bequeath unto Levir Weeks
and Delia Johnson one horse my entire stock of cattle
and the tract of land upon which I now live (except
my Mother's dower) to be equally divided between
them in witness whereof I do hereunto set my
hand and seal this 21st day of Dec^r 1852
