I Eliza C. Weston of the State of Georgia being at this time sick and disposing mind & memory do make declare and publish this to be my last will & Testament as follows to wit
I direct that my body after death be buried in a decent & Christian-like manner

Secondly After payment of my just debts I will & bequeath unto my Son in law William C. Dickinson the entire residue of my Estate whether the same may consist of Monies, Bonds, Notes, Accounts or of any other evidence of debt all my choses in action & all my goods & chattels rights and credits in law or in Equity of which I may be possessed of or indebted too to have and to hold the same or the monies arising from the said choses in action or evidence of debt when collected to I for the use of my Daughter Elizabeth J. Dickinson wife of the said William C. Dickinson for & during her life to be used disposed of & conveyed or mortgaged by him the said William C. Dickinson in such manner as she the said Elizabeth may direct and I make the above bequest with the express understanding I wish that my Estate bequeathed as aforesaid shall in no event be subject to any present or future liability of him the said William C. Dickinson

Thirdly It is my wish should the said Elizabeth J. Dickinson depart this life leaving the aforesaid Effects or any part of them unconsumed that the same shall then go to such child or children of her the said Elizabeth J. Dickinson or may be living at the time of her death to be equally divided between them

Fourth To my Son Edward C. Dickerson a Minor I leave Nothing. It is my will that William C. Dickinson my said Son in law act as my Executor to carry into effect this my last will & Testament

and of the uncertainty of the hour thereof of opinion
that I may be the better prepared to leave this world
whenever it shall please Almighty God to call me home
do make devise and declare this my last will and
testament, that is to say

First I give and bequeath unto my
