I of Eliza C. Weston of the County and State aforesaid being in this hour of my mind and disposing mind & memory do make declare and publish this to be my last will & Testament as follows to wit

I do direct that my body after death be buried in decent & Christian-like manner

Secondly After payment of my just debts I will & bequeath unto my Son in law William C. Dickerson the entire residue of my Estate whether the same may consist of Money, Bonds, Notes, Accounts or of any other evidence of debt all my chose in action & all my goods & chattels rights and credits in law or in Equity of which I may be possessed of or indebted too to have and to hold the same or the moneys arising from the said chose in action or evidence of debt when collected to & for the use of my Daughter Elizabeth J. Dickerson wife of the said William C. Dickerson for & during her life to be used disposed of & conveyed or mortgaged by him the said William C. Dickerson in such manner as she the said Elizabeth may direct and I make the aforesaid bequest with the express understanding & wish that my Estate bequeathed as aforesaid shall in no event be subject to any present or future liability of him the said William C. Dickerson

Thirdly It is my wish should the said Elizabeth J. Dickerson depart this life leaving the aforesaid Effects or any part of thereof unencumbered that the same shall then go to such child or children of her the said Elizabeth J. Dickerson or may be living at the time of her death to be equally divided between them

Fourth Do my Son Edward C. Dickerson & I leave Nothing. It is my will that William C. Dickerson my said Son in law act as my Executor to carry into effect this my last will & Testament

Rachley of the county of Deatur and State of
Georgia being weak in body but of sound disposing
mind and memory. Cautious of the certainty of death
and of the uncertainty of the hour thereof I do hereby
testify that I may be the better prepared to leave this world
whenever it shall please Almighty God to call me home
do make devise and declare this my last will and
testament, that is to say

First I give and bequeath unto my
beloved wife Prudog and my Children William
S. Lydia Sarah Ann. Missouri and John Calvin
all my property of every kind to be divided equally
amongst them share and share alike to have and to
hold the same in absolute property to them and their
heirs forever And I desire that the share of my said
wife should be allowed to her whenever she may re-
quest the same to be paid but the shares of my
Children I desire should be kept together dividing
off to each his or her ^{part} respective share when they
obtain the age of Twenty one year or there in
case any of my said Children shall die
