I desire and direct that all my just debts  
be paid by my executor herein after named

Item third

I give and devise to my beloved wife son  
William Ingram one half of lot of land number  
two hundred & seventy two (No 272) in the twelfth  
of formerly Early but now Secaton County which is to  
be divided diagonally beginning at the north west  
corner & run a straight line from thence to the south  
west corner of said land the Spring which I am  
now using from containing eighty or ninety acres  
be the same more or less - it being the south west part  
of said land.

Item fourth—

I give and bequeath to my beloved Grand-  
son Hugh Nicholas Ingram the other half of said  
lot of land (that is the remaining balance of the  
said land No. 272 in said 20<sup>th</sup> District)

Item fifth—

I give and bequeath to my beloved son  
John Ingram thirty five or forty acres of land be the  
same more or less situated lying and being in the  
in the twelfth (20<sup>th</sup>) District of formerly Early but  
now Secaton County known & distinguished by the  
No. 249. the same being in the North West corner  
of said lot of land

Item 6<sup>th</sup>

I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter  
Nancy Lamb and to her children my negro  
Norman Miller

Item 7<sup>th</sup>—

I give and devise to my grand son Hugh Nicholas Ingram my negro woman named Sarah

Item 8<sup>th</sup>—

I give and devise to my beloved son John Ingram my negro girl named Sarah and also one Featherbed

Item 9<sup>th</sup>—

I give and devise to my beloved son Jackson Ingram my negro woman named Rachel and also one Featherbed

Item 10<sup>th</sup>—

I give and bequeath all my stock of cattle to be equally divided between all my children

Item 11<sup>th</sup>—

I give and bequeath all my stock of Hogs to my beloved son Hugh Ingram all my stock of Hogs

Item 12<sup>th</sup>—

I give and bequeath to my beloved grand son Hugh Nicholas Ingram one chestnut barrel Horse

Item 13<sup>th</sup>—

I give and bequeath all the rest of my property both real and personal wherever and whatever it may be to be equally divided between all my children - except one part which I wish to belong equally to all my sons only

Item 14<sup>th</sup>

I constitute and appoint my beloved son John Ingram and William Chester Executors to this my last will and Testament this August 10<sup>th</sup> 1847
