3^o Item - I give bequeath & desire to my daugh-
ter Olive Johnson & my son John Johnson
Lot of Land No 411 four hundred and
elevan in the 21 district of originally
Early now Decatur County containing
two hundred and fifty acres more or
less all except forty acres which is here-
inafter described I also desire and bequeath
to the said Olive and John all my house-
hold and Kitchen furniture even Godd-

and me also our son will have 16 years
old thirteen head of cattle twelve heads
of hogs all except so much as it will
take to pay my debts and two small
legacies that I shall name hereinafter
in this will.

Item - I give and bequeath and devise
to my son William F. Johnson forty
acres of said Lot of Land heretofore
described lying in a square in the bottom
Each corner of said lot -

Item - I give bequeath and devise to my
son Noah W. Johnson the sum of five
dollars to be raised out of my effects
as heretofore directed.

Item - I give bequeath and devise to my
son in law Thomas R. C. Lewis five dollars
to be raised as heretofore directed.

Item - I hereby constitute and appoint
my son William F. Johnson and my
worthy friend Moses Johnson executors
of this my Last Will & Testament. This
