John Harrell Jr. being infirm in body though of sound  
mind and memory do make and ordain this my  
last Will and Testament viz 1<sup>st</sup> I desire that some  
part of my perishable Estate be sold as will pay off of  
subany just debts if any 2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath to my  
first Daughter Jean Dollar and my sons Elisha Harrell  
and William Harrell. Josiah Harrell and my Daughter Kelly  
as at present with the sum of Eighty Dollars each in cash or cattle  
as they chose the said sum to belong to their children  
after my Death. 3<sup>rd</sup> I bequeath and give to my son  
John Harrell the sum of Eighty Dollars in cash or cattle  
as he chooses. 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my son  
William M. Harrell the sum of one thousand Dollars in  
cash or cattle as he may choose. 5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath  
to my Daughter Maryann. Rachel Harrell the sum  
of one hundred and Fifty Dollars in cash or cattle as she  
may choose. 6<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife  
Anna the sum of Five Hundred Dollars in cash or  
cattle as she may <sup>choose</sup> which is to be her property  
during her lifetime or if she should then to belong to  
my son William M. Harrell as his property and then at the death  
of the said William M. Harrell his whole Estate to go to  
his heirs. I also desire that all the balance of my  
perishable <sup>Estate</sup> household and kitchen furniture  
to be sold on a credit of 6 months immediately after  
my death: and I also desire that my heirs should  
equally divide the proceeds of said sale among them  
selves. I do appoint and ordain my two sons  
Josiah and Cauas Harrell my lawful Executors  
I put special confidence in the judgement and  
integrity of my Executors I desire that they dispense  
with making returns as required by law. I give  
my Executors power to manage for the minor

having revoked all former wills made by me in the
