Testament.

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body
be buried in a decent manner suitable
to my circumstances and condition

Item 2^d I desire and direct that all my
just debts be paid without delay by
my executors hereinafter named

Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my wife
Elizabeth the following negroes to wit
Peter a man 45 years old Susan a woman
40 years old and Sarah a girl 12 years
old I also give and bequeath to my wife
all of the lot of land upon which I
now live lying on the east side of the Blue
Spring branch lying in the 3^d district of
said county and known as Lot number
three hundred and eleven (311) I also give
and bequeath to my wife my horse and buggy
I Mule known by name of Cap-fire (5) Sows
& Calves - 5 some pigs such as she may
choose from my stock of hogs and cattle
as much household and kitchen furni-
ture as she may choose from my lot
also 1 two-wheel wagon - Two hundred & fifty
bushels of Corn and three stacks of fodder
- fifteen hundred (1500) pounds of hick and
such farming utensils as she may choose
from my stock also a childs part

of what money I may have on hand at my death all of which I give and bequeath to my wife during her natural life and at her death or marriage to be divided equally between my children

Item 4th I desire and direct that the remainder of my negro property be appraised and drawn for & divided equally between my children Tomib Elizabeth Bailey wife of Burnett A Bailey, John M. Hutto, Martha Pace wife of William M Pace, Mary Daniels wife of Peter Daniels my son William Hutto and my son Ardin K. Hutto.

Item 5th I desire and direct that the rest of my property (not herein before enumerated) wherever and whatever it may be (be sold and proceeds to be divided equally between my children as mentioned in the 4th Item

Item 6th I give and bequeath extra to my son Ardin K. Hutto 1 bed and furniture and a good servicable horse to him & his heirs forever, I appoint William M. Pace guardian of the person and property of my said minor son Ardin K. Hutto.

Item 7th I constitute and appoint my son John M. Hutto, William M. Pace and Peter Daniels Executors of this my last Will & Testament this 9th day of September 1860
