I therefore make this my last will and
testament, hereby revoking and annulling all
others heretofore made by me.
Item first: I desire and direct that my body
be buried in a decent and Christianlike
manner, suitable to my circumstances and
condition. My soul I trust shall return to
rest with God who gave it, as I hope for
eternal glorification through the blessed Lord
and Saviour Jesus Christ. Whose religion I
have professed and I humbly trust enjoyed
for years.

Item second: I desire and direct that all
my just debts be paid. Without delay by
my Executor herein after named.

Item third: I give and devise to my two
grand sons Homer and Richard Ingory, now.

 It is my wish: I give and devise to James Jones

 beloved Wife Elizabeth a certain Negro boy
 named Moses and a certain Son of a Cott
 known as "James filly" to him and his
 heirs forever.
 Item fifth: all the rest of my property not
 herein before disposed of both real and
 personal Whichever and Whichever it may be.
 I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter
 Celiza Garland, to her use benefit and control
 for and during her natural life time only.
 And after her death it shall be disposed
 of in the following named manner to wit:
 That is to say it shall be divided into
 as many equal parts as there are living
 Children of Nathaniel Garland and Amanda
 Jones formerly Amanda Garland and children
 of the said Celiza Garland. One of these equal
 parts to be given to Green Monroe Jones
 Son of George H. Jones and his Wife Amanda
 formerly Amanda Garland. And all the

Garland to them and their heirs forever,
