 Nickleberry Morn Ten dollars.
 Item 3^d I give to my son Richard Regan Ten dollars.
 Item 4th I give to my son John Regan Ten dollars.
 Item 5th I give to my daughter Polly Jorin Ten dollars.
 Item 6th It is my will that my Wife Elizabeth
 shall have everything of value that belonged to her
 before our marriage and also one year's support
 from and after my death.
 Item 7th It is my will that after my death
 my Executor shall sell all my ^{personal} ~~personal~~ Estate
 including the negroes, crop, stock tools &c. and
 also collect from Melly B Jorin the overplus
 left after paying himself arising from the
 sale of the land on which I now live. and
 the legal title to which I conveyed to said

Joiner to receive him, and with these seems
 constitute a fund. Which after all just demands,
 against my estate are paid. I wish divide among
 my six children. Isaac B. Regan, Robert Regan
 and William Regan and Jane Wife of Benjamin
 Ward, Martha Wife of Jeremiah Midden and
 Louisa Clay, in such manner that Martha and
 Louisa shall each have two hundred dollars.
 More than Jane, and Jane to have one
 hundred dollars more than the share of Isaac
 B. Robert and William, who are all to have
 the same or equal sums rich with the other

 of October 1855 A.D.
