

# Will of Thomas Paim

I Thomas Paim of the State of Georgia being in a good state of health at this time; But calling to mind the mortality of all men and knowing that it is appointed for all to die; I do therefore constitute this my last will & testament.

First of all I recommend my soul to the hands of almighty God, who give it to me; and my worldly estate my will is, that first my beloved wife keep & enjoy all the property, both real & personal during her natural life; and one year after her death in the second place my will is that my son Thomas P. Paim, shall have the land whereon I now live, and the lot adjoining, which is not fifty four & fifty five acres in the twenty second district of the County Early now Decatur County, with all the appurtenances belonging thereto, to have & to hold the same, and in the third place, that after the death of my wife, that all the rest of my property be sold & out of the money arising from said sale, I bequeath in the following manner to wit: I give to Mary Martin two hundred dollars, to Rebecca Mc Mullen two hundred dollars, to Clony Strickland two hundred dollars to Saml Whildon, two hundred dollars & to John M. Bell two hundred dollars, and to Sovey Marshall two hundred dollars, and in the fourth place that if any remains, for it to be equally divided amongst the heirs, with the exception of Thomas P. Paim, for he is to have no part but the land above mentioned. In the fifth place & last place I appoint Thomas P. Paim & Joseph Marshall the Executors of this my last will & testament.
