



I give to my son William D. Donaldson the plantation during the life time of my beloved wife. After her death to be divided between my sons in such a manner as they may agree upon also One Negro man and Burro and one buggy to be disposed of as my sons may see proper.

3<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my son William D. Donaldson lot of land No 56 in the 20<sup>th</sup> district of formerly Early now DeCATUR County or so much thereof as lies in the East end of the Alleged road creek and also the stump and red mud or life lying on the West end of said creek which is now fenced in to its self and in cultivation being a part of said Lot of land No 56 in the 20<sup>th</sup> Dist. Also Two Negro men Slaves by the name of Charles and Henry

4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my son William D. Donaldson Two Negro men Slaves one by the name of Charles and the other by the name of Levi also two Lots of land numbers 65 and 96 both in the 20<sup>th</sup> district of formerly Early now DeCATUR County I give jointly between him and my son George W. Donaldson to be divided between them as they may agree upon between themselves or to occupy and possess the same in common and joint need here. Except however that the time is ending is to remain with the property of my beloved wife Rachel during her natural life to and after her death to be the property of my said son William D. Donaldson.

5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my Daughter Jane Melvin Two Negro Slaves as follows to wit. Blackie a woman and her four children three boys named as follows to wit Lewis, Vanny & Turner and one girl named Mary all of which is now in her possession.

6<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Swicord One Negro man Slave named Jim. also a horse and some cattle besides other property all of which has been delivered and now in her possession.

7<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary C. Griffin One Negro girl Slave named Hannah also One Slave Girl in the County of Alleged and one Black Horse

9<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Christ  
a negro Girl named Matilda also One Bird  
situated

10 I give and bequeath to my son George W. Dunsen and  
Negro man Elard named just in addition to his part  
of the land which negro man has been allowed to have besides  
other property

11 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Estlin  
One Negro Girl named Dilia which has been allowed  
to her and now in her possession

12 I give & direct that my lot of land numbered 7. in the  
20<sup>th</sup> District of Family Early New Creation County be  
Reserved and unexpended of during the life of my beloved  
Wife for the purpose of furnishing and timber to keep the  
& money in good repairs and after her death to be disposed  
of as my ~~sons~~ may see proper The rest of my property  
both real & personal where ever & whatever it may be  
I give and bequeath to be Equally divided between my three  
Sons in such manner as they may agree upon I appoint  
my Trusty & worthy friends Wm. Chester & George Dunsen  
Executors to this my last will and Testament this  
the fifth day of May 1853

and privilege for her to dispose of at her will & pleasure  
in full power to dispose of at any time before  
or at her death as she may think proper in the same manner  
as provided for in the Direction of my said last Will & Testament  
which disposes of a Negro Woman named Louisa and a boy named  
Pachmitt. My Friend William Chester and my son  
Geo W Dinslow who I have appointed & constituted my Executors  
to my said last Will is also constituted and appointed
