1st Item - I desire & direct that my body be buried in a decent & christianlike manner suitable to my circumstances & condition in life my soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for eternal salvation through the merits & atonement of the blessed Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ -

2^d Item - I desire & direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter appointed as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed in their rights - especially as there is no necessity for delay -

3^d Item) I give bequeath & devise to my beloved wife Jane with whom I have lived in the strictest quiet for nearly thirty four years Lot of Land No Two hundred sixty four & the north half of Lot of Land No Two hundred sixty five in the Nineteenth district of Deaton County containing in all Three hundred & seventy five acres about fifty acres cleared & in cultivation with all

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will belonging free from all charges or limita-
-tion whatever to have & to hold the same
during her natural life only And at the
death of my beloved wife I am the parcels
of Land above named & bequeathed to her
to revert to my son Trade C. Kelly pro-
-vided he shall remain with & cultivate
or cause to be cultivated the plantation
before mentioned so as to support, clothe
& feed & take care of his mother during
her life in a christianlike manner—

4th Item— I give bequeath & devise to my daughter
Elizabeth Paulandingham wife of John
Paulandingham all her children free from
the disposition of her present or any future
husband my negr boy Jack about fourteen
years of age forever & I appoint my trusty
worthy conin-lan John Paulandingham
Trustee of the property herein given & bequea-
-thed to my daughter Elizabeth Paulandingham
her children—

5th Item— I give bequeath & devise to my daughter
Mary Ann Johnson wife of Peter Johnson &
all her children free from the disposition
of her present or any future husband my
negr girl Kizins about twelve years of
age forever & I appoint my trusty conin-
-lan Peter Johnson Trustee of the property
herein given & bequeathed to my daughter
Mary Ann Johnson & all of her children—

6th Item— I give bequeath & devise to my son
Trade C. Kelly my negr boy James about
seventeen years of age forever to him—

7th Item— I give bequeath & devise to my daughter
Elizabeth Paulandingham wife of John Paulandingham
all her children free from the disposition of her present or any future husband my negr boy Jack about fourteen years of age forever & I appoint my trusty worthy conin-lan John Paulandingham Trustee of the property herein given & bequeathed to my daughter Elizabeth Paulandingham her children—

appoint my beloved wife Jane & my
worthy & trusty friend George Kelly Indian
for the persons & property of my two minor
children Wade & Margaret L. Kelly -

8th Item I desire that the negroes of the
two minor children be kept together &
worked in common until the youngest
child comes of age to wit Margaret L.

9th Item - The residue of my property consist-
-ing of Hues hoggs Cattle New Cast Prags
Blaggy & Farming Utensels household &
Kitchen Furniture as well as the Corn
fodder on my plantation I give & bequeath
to my beloved wife Jane to have & to hold
until my youngest daughter comes of
age & marries it to be kept together
for the use & support of my wife Jane
& for the education & support of my
two minor children Wade & Margaret
& after the youngest daughter shall
become of age & marry the property
bequeathed in the ninth Item shall after
a bed of furniture has been reserved to
Wade & Margaret L set apart for
them each forever then the remainder
contained in the ninth Item to be equally
divided amongst my wife & four children

10th Item - I hereby constitute & appoint my
worthy son-in-law Peter Johnson & George
Kelly Executors of this my last will
& Testament this the 18th day of October
