

Ms cordia May 24<sup>th</sup> 1839

I William Whidson of Pecan County and State  
of Georgia being weak of body but of sound mind mind and  
disposing memory do make this my last will and Testament  
in manner and form following - I do hereby revoke all  
other will or wills heretofore made by me and do hereby commit  
my soul to God that gave it and my body to the dust from  
whence it came. In the first place I give and bequeath  
to my beloved wife three several tracts of Land lying in  
County and being under the care of George Carter son  
of Mr Inlosh County also money or moneys that is  
now or will hereafter become due from Eats of any part or  
parts of said Land or Lands - (I will now bring in  
what ought to have been first)

She will and desire it that all my last debts & funeral  
expenses be first paid out of my Estate by my Executors  
Next I give and bequeath to Sarah Whidson my wife two  
feather beds & furniture & bed Sticks also the French bell  
furniture that belonged to her at the time of our marriage  
that was brought home with us also one horse  
called Derrick in choice of two cows & colts out of my  
stock also two Lively Sows and pigs all one year possession  
Also I give my wife Sarah the one half of all my  
kitchen furniture & furniture my Bureau and one dressing  
Glas also an candle stand six sitting Chairs also  
I give my wife one Copper fire iron two Flap Peccanters two  
Flap Tumbler and half of all my Bottles Lugs & Lugs  
and two cutting boards and one Iron mangle and  
one Woolen Wheel All the above recited articles that has herein  
been given to my wife Sarah Whidson in my last will and  
Testament I do hereby give the whole to her and she her heirs  
Also my will and desire it that my wife have a certain portion  
of any lot of Land whereon I now live during her life time  
but not to have the right or power to sell said Land the portion  
of said Land the portion of said Land atested for her

During his Will to stay on it shall begin on the East  
line of the lot on which I now live south of the range of  
the North side of the Orchard fence which is just opposite  
the ~~city~~ <sup>city</sup> of the sugar cane (patch) running through the  
field that course up the corner of that line to the middle of  
a bottom thence running down the meanders of that until  
it becomes a small branch and running through the  
field unto another small branch thence up said branch  
until it strikes the south line of said tract above mentioned  
to the south east corner thence along the East line to the  
beginning place first above mentioned this boundary includes  
all the houses on the premises together with all the cleared and  
woodland land within this boundary all the above described  
together with all the houses and out houses I own during my  
life time provided she stays on said premises until her death  
Also one half the plantation tools for her use during her  
pleasure to stay on said premises Also for her to have the  
use of the sugar mill and boilers during her stay.

Now let it be understood that all of the above mentioned estate  
property that has had any allusion to duration of life time  
is to be understood in this way provided my wife should  
marry again then all of the above life time property to  
revert back in manner following -

My will and desire is & I do hereby execute that my  
Nephew John Whiddow whom I have raised from a child  
should have all of my real and personal estate that  
has not been disposed of before (to my wife) and it is also  
my will and desire that if my wife should marry again  
or should remove from the premises that I have left her during  
her widowhood or pleasure to stay on said premises then  
then all the above plantation property that was not given  
to my wife & hers and after her death I do hereby give and  
bequeath unto my Nephew John Whiddow all of the rest of  
my real and personal estate and all and every part or  
parcel that I may be possessed of at the time of my

Witness I do hereby Nominate And Appoint  
Jesse Percy and Robert McNaie my Executors to this my  
Last will and Testament

I do hereby Revoke all will or wills heretofore made by me  
and do declare this to be my Last will and Testament

my Seal this fourth day of January one thousand eight  
hundred and thirty three
