

At the above day I Robert Smith of the State and  
County aforesaid being weak  
in body, but of sound & disposing Mind and  
Memory, do make this my last will and  
testament. In the first place, I commit my soul  
into the hands of Almighty God not doubting  
but that he will save by through the merits of  
the sufferings of our Lord Jesus Christ. My body  
I desire to be buried in such manner as my  
executors here in after appointed shall think  
proper. With regard to my worldly estate, my  
will & desire is that it be disposed of as follows  
In the first place, I give & bequeath to my  
beloved wife Encinda, the youngest child of Rachel  
(my Negro woman) known by the name of Berry, during  
her life time and at her death to be equally  
divided among my four sons Nathaniel Smith,  
Nathaniel A. Smith, James M. Smith and  
Robert H. Smith. Also give & bequeath to  
my said wife Encinda three hundred dollars  
in cash, of money that may remain of my  
estate, after paying all just demands against  
my said estate. My carriage, which I usually  
used to the same, and Cow & Calf, one sow  
& Pigs, my cows, our Bridle, are saddles, all  
the property she brought with her when I married  
her, what she may have made since that time  
and one year provisions for her self and  
stocks - also one fourth part of Table & Kitchen furniture;  
I give & bequeath to my son William R.  
Smith his three Neves to wit, Jerry, Judy, Miles

of My Stock of horses, with the right of choice,  
Thirdly. I give & bequeath to My Son James N. Smith  
a Negro Woman by the Name of Peggy & her  
two Children which he now has in his  
possession.

Fourthly. I give & bequeath to My Son Nathaniel  
N. Smith an Negro Woman by the Name of  
Rachel and two of her Children to wit Adeline  
and Joseph. Adeline I desire to be given to  
My Said Son Nathaniel, eldest Son Robert  
when he arrives at the age of twenty one  
years I also give to My Son Nathaniel N.  
My two large Dictionaries.

Fifthly. I give & bequeath to My Son Robert  
N. Smith the Plantation on which he did  
live in Rutherford County in the State of  
North Carolina. Also an Negro Woman by  
the Name of Ginny and her two children,  
which he now has in his possession.

Sixthly. I give & bequeath to My Grand Son William  
B. Smith the Second Son of My son Robert  
N. Smith who is now living with me the  
youngest Child of My also beloved Marie a  
good Bridle, Saddle, and a good suit of  
Clothes and fifty dollars in Cash Also a  
liberal English Education. The expence of which  
education to be paid out of the balance of  
My estate not here in disposed of. Provided  
he my said Grand Son William B. Smith  
do remain with me during my life time  
or until he arrives to the age of twenty one  
year.

I desire that all the Money that I May  
have in my hands at my death and otherwise  
not paid off in the first giving part of this  
(My will) to be equally divided between my  
sons James Williams R. Smith, James Smith,  
Nathaniel St. Smith and Robert W. Smith.  
I entreat also all valuable papers of my estate to be  
collected and equally divided between  
My two sons Williams R. Smith, James  
Williams Nathaniel Smith and Robert W.  
Smith.

Constantly I desire that each of my sons keep tho  
a few (mentionable) Negroes in their families  
as long as they can.

My trust. I give to Mrs. Ald. Negus Brown Ning  
Promises to live with either of my sons  
whom she may select & I request upon death  
that you take care of her & treat her  
well during her life.

Trust. I desire that the balance of my Estate not  
less than otherwise is disposed of like equaly divided  
between my children

trust. I do hereby acknowledge and appoint  
Mr. Tracy and Mr. Fletcher to see William  
R. Smith and Robert W. Smith Directors  
of this my last will and Testament

think that there is that difference in the  
Value of the two Negro Men, I further des  
that Lewis should be near to his Wife in  
circumstances will admit.

Eighthly. I give & bequeath to My son William R.C.  
Smith our Bed and furniture with the right of  
choice of four Beds.

Ninthly. I give & bequeath to My son James H.  
Smith our Bed and furniture with the right  
of second choice of four.

Tenthly. I give & bequeath to My son Nathaniel J.  
Smith our Bed and furniture with the right  
of third choice of four.

Eleventhly. I give & bequeath to My son Robert H. Smith  
our Bed and furniture with the right of  
fourth & last choice of four & all of My Mar

Twelfthly. I desire that all the remaining part of  
My estate, Not here in otherwise disposed of  
(Excepting the remainder of My Books) to be sold

and the proceeds, after paying all law  
Costs against My said Estate, and reasonable  
expenses to My Executors for their services &  
other necessary expenses in executing this  
My last will, to be equally divided betw  
My four Sons William R.C. Smith, James H.  
Smith, Nathaniel J. Smith and Robert H. Smith.
