sing mind & memory knowing that
I must shortly depart this life deem
it right & proper both on respects
my family and myself that I
should make a disposition of the
property with which a kind Providence
has blessed me I do therefore make
this my last Will & Testament hereby
revoking and annulling all others
by me heretofore made.

First - I desire and direct that my
body be buried in a decent and
Christian like manner suitable to
my circumstances and conditions
in life.

Secondly - I desire and direct that
all my just debts be paid by my Exec-
utor hereinafter appointed.

Thirdly - I give and bequeath to my
beloved wife Fervelia Elizabeth for
and during her natural life only
the west half of lot of land num-
ber six in the fifthenth District of
DeKalb County containing one
hundred one and one fourth acres
and all of my Stock of all kinds
and all of my plantation Tools
and waggons and Buggies and all
of the supplies consisting of corn whea-
t, fodder, shucks meal Flour or
meat and Lard and all of my House-
hold and Kitchen furniture that

is not otherwise disposed of in this Will.
Fourthly - I give and bequeath and de-
vise to my son William H. The east
half of lot of land numbered six in the
fifteenth district of DeKalb County
containing one hundred and one
and one fourth acres with all the
rights and appurtenances in any
wise belonging forever in fee simple
Fifthly - I give and bequeath and
devise to my daughter Annanah C.
Boroden wife of Walter T. Boroden
fifty dollars I having given my Daugh-
ter Annanah C. Boroden heretofore in
property and money to the amount
of Three hundred Dollars.

Sixthly - The west half of lot of land
numbered six in the fifteenth district of
DeKalb County containing one hundred
one and one fourth acres given to my
wife Permelia Elizabeth in the third
article of this Will for and during
her natural life only (after her natural
life is over) I give bequeath and de-
vise to my minor Daughter Sarah V.
L. E. and to my minor son Harvey
jointly in fee simple and forever
and if either should die leaving
no heirs the other or his to have the
property in this article of this Will.

And I hereby appoint my son William
H. Spradberry Executor of the persons
and property of my said minor
Daughter Sarah V. L. E. and my said
minor son Harvey.

Seventhly - I give and bequeath
to my son Price H. one Blue Chest-
Eighthly - I give and bequeath to my son

Ninthly - I give and bequeath to my minor
daughter Sarah V. L. & one bedstead
feather bed & bed clothing one red
chest and the sewing Machine.

Tenthly - I give and bequeath to my
minor son Harvey J. one bedstead
one feather bed and bed clothing
one horse bridle and saddle to be
worth one hundred & twenty five
dollars and one side board the
horse bridle and saddle to be given
to my minor Harvey J. when he
becomes twenty one years of age
or at the death of my wife ~~Permelia~~
Elizabeth

Eleventhly I give and bequeath and
devise to my grandson John S. Spray
berry one hundred & fifty dollars
to be paid by my executor herein
after appointed at the death of
my wife ~~Permelia~~ Elizabeth or
when he becomes twenty one years of
age after my wife's death.

Twelfthly - I give and bequeath & devise
to my minor grandson Francis E.
South twenty five dollars to Francis
C. South twenty five dollars to Thomas
W. Sprayberry twenty five dollars to be
paid to them by my executor hereinafter
appointed at the death of my wife
Elizabeth or when each of them becomes
twenty one years of age after my wife's death.

Thirteenthly - The residue of my property
both real and personal wherever and
whatever it may be including that given
to my wife ~~Permelia~~ Elizabeth in the
will for and during

her natural life (after her estate there
in is over) except the west half of lot
number six which is given to my minor
daughter Sarah V. L. E. and my minor
son Harvey J. jointly in the sixth article
of this will I desire and direct that
my executor hereinafter appointed adver-
tise and sell it to the highest bidder
and the proceeds accruing from the
sale of the property mentioned in this
article of this will, first to be appropri-
ated to the payment of my grandsons
namely Francis E. South & Francis C.
South, the amount that may due each
of them as the guardian of their prop-
erty, Secondly to the payment of the
money bequest made in this will.

Thirdly whatever may then be left to be
equally divided between my sons
Brice M. William H. Harbey J and
my daughter Sarah V. L. E.
Fourthly - I hereby constitute and
appoint my son William H. Sprayberry
and E. Morris Executors to this my
last will and testament: this
January 27th 1876.
