This Indenture made & entered into this County of 23rd day of March A.D. 1844 By and between Stephen P. East of the County of Carroll and State aforesaid of the one part and Thomas Cannell of the County and State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said Stephen has this day bargained & sold unto the said Thomas one negro girl by the name of Rose about 16 years of age for the sum of one hundred and seventy two dollars to me in hand paid by the said Thomas the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged as well as the delivery to the said Thomas one promissory note for one hundred & seventy two dollars made pay able the twenty fifth day of December next and dated the 20th March 1844 The said Stephen has this day granted bargain and sold unto these presents grant bargain sell & forever deliver to him the said Thomas his heirs & assigns the aforesaid negro girl named Rose To have & to hold the said negro girl to him the said Thomas his heirs and assigns to his only use benefit and behoof of him the said Stephen Cannell and the said Stephen P. East his heirs and assigns the said negro girl unto the said Thomas his heirs & assigns does by these presents form warrant now affixed against the claim of all persons or persons whatever Province Northumbia if the said Stephen his heirs & assigns shall will & truly pay or cause to be paid to the said Thomas his heirs & assigns the above note it being one hundred & seventy two dollars on the day and term mentioned for the payment of said note then & thereupon as well this present instant and the right thirty days next ensuing
