 of Georgia of the second part. Witnesseth that the said Edmund  
 & Bradley for and in the consideration of the sum of three  
 hundred dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof  
 is hereby acknowledged hath this day bargained sold and conveyed  
 unto the said William T. Cobb all that tract or parcel of land  
 situate lying and being in the fifteenth district of originally  
 Henry now DeKalb County now and distinguished in  
 the plan of said District by the number 422 one hundred  
 and twenty two & being all of said lot of land with  
 the exception of one hundred acres on the North side  
 or line of said lot of land supposed to contain one  
 hundred and fifty eight acres be it the same more or less  
 together with all and singular the rights Members and  
 appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise incident to  
 the premises before mentioned unto the said William T. Cobb  
 to him his heirs executors administrators and assigns & the  
 said Edmund & Bradley for Minely his heirs executors admin-  
 istrators & assigns do warrant and forever defend the rights  
 and titles of the before named premises in fee simple unto  
 the said William T. Cobb and his assigns against the claim  
 of Minely and his assigns & against the claim or claim  
 of every and every other person or persons lawfully claiming  
 or to claim or to claim the same or any part thereof either in  
 law or in equity in testimony whereof I have hereunto set  
 my hand and affix my seal the day and date first  
 above written in the
