 Waller in and for the Consideration of the sum of
 two hundred Dollars to him in hand paid at the time
 of the making and giving of these presents the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargain &
 sold and so by these presents grant bargain and sell
 forever all that tract or parcel of Land Situate lying
 and being in the fourth and sixth District of the County
 of Fayette at the time of Survey but now in the County
 of DeKalb which said lot or parcel of Land is known
 and distinguished in the plan of said District by the
 No 41 Part two having such shape from marks and
 quantity as well more fully appear by the original
 plat and grant issued from the Executive Department
 of this State To have and to hold all and singular
 the rights liberties and appurtenances whithersoever
 belonging from in for himself and for the said John
 H. C. Waller do covenant and for ever defend the premises
 aforesaid from myself my heirs Executors & administrators
 and all and every other person or persons whithersoever
 the aforesaid Lewis Peacock his heirs and assigns forever to his
 and their own proper use benefit and behoof in writings
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day

Georgia Whereas in obedience to a writ of fieri
 facias issued from the Superior Court of the
 County of DeKalb at the Suit of the Capital Bank of Georgia
 against James Rump Master John L. Evans Charles Seim &
 William R. Rump Indians and J. Almon Security on May 1 John
 W. Hughes Sheriff of said County did lawfully seize the parcels
 of Land hereinafter described as the property of the said
 James Rump and after the same being duly examined and
 found due on the fifth day of September in the year
 one thousand eight hundred and forty three at the place of public
 sale held by the Sheriff of DeKalb County

grant bargain sell and convey so far as the office of Sheriff
authorizes him unto the said Amos Williams his heirs and
assigns all the following tracts or parcels of late tenements
one hundred and thirty seven men or less the same being
part of late number one hundred and six and fifty three
whereon there is a saw and grist mill situated lying and
being in the eighteenth district of originally Henry but
now DeKalb County together in the all and singular the
rights manners and appurtenances thereof and also all the
estate right title interest claim and demand of the said
Amos Williams in law Equity or otherwise whatever of unto
to the same to have and to hold the said premises and
every part thereof unto the said Amos Williams his heirs
and assigns in as full and ample a manner as the
said Amos Williams or his heirs and assigns did then and
enjoy the same had it not been seized and later under
the execution aforesaid. In witness whereof the said John
W. Fowler Sheriff aforesaid hath hereunto set his hand and
affixed his seal the day and year first aforesaid.

J. John W. Fowler Sheriff of the County first aforesaid
