with all and singular the rights numbers and appurtenance

wise appertaining and more especially the rights of way over  
the same, "To have and to hold the same unto the said Georgia  
Rail Road and Banking Company their successors and assigns  
to their own proper use benefit and behoof forever in fee simple  
upon condition and it is expressly understood that  
should the said Rail Road contemplated as a possession be not  
located and established on and along said strip tract or parcel  
of land described in the above and foregoing indenture then  
said indenture is to be wholly null and void and of no effect  
and the said Joseph S M Patterson for his heirs and assigns  
will warrant and forever defend the title therof unto the Georgia  
Rail Road and Banking Company their successors and assigns  
against the claims of all persons whatsoever. In witness whereof

Georgia This Indenture made this Eighteenth day of January  
DeKalb County in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
and forty four, Between Littleton Jackson of said County  
of the one part and the Georgia Rail Road and Banking Company  
of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Littleton Jackson for and  
in consideration of running their contemplated Rail Roads on  
and along his land as well as in consideration of the sum of one  
dollar to him in hand paid at and before the sealing and deliv-  
ery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged  
doth give grant bargain and sell unto the said Georgia Rail Road  
and Banking Company and their successors and assigns the right  
of way over which to pass at all times by themselves directors  
officers agents, henchings and servants in any manner they may  
think proper and particularly for the purpose of running,  
erecting and establishing thereon a rail road with the required  
number of tracks pursuant to charter of incorporation for  
the twenty first day of December eighteen hundred and  
three and amended at subsequent meetings of the legislative  
assembly by conferring Banking powers and the power  
extending the road from Monroe to

of the Walker and Gwin Rail Road, And to this end the  
limit of said right of way shall extend in width thirty three  
and one third (33 $\frac{1}{3}$ ) yards on each side of the centre line of the  
said way of the said Rail Road when completed and to extend  
in length through the whole tract of land joined and claimed  
by the said Littleton Jackson situated being in  
Dekalb county adjoining lands of Ross north east by  
Philips, south by Fane, west by Gaughn and running in su-  
ch direction through said tract of land as the Georgia  
Rail Road and Banking Company by their Engineers shall  
think best suited for the purpose of locating and establishing  
their works. And connected with said right of way the said  
company shall have the right to cut down and remove all

or less, together with all and singular his rights immovable  
and appurtenances to the same strip tract or parcel of land  
being belonging or in any wise appertaining and more espe-  
cially the right of way over the same, To have and to  
hold the same unto the said Georgia Rail Road & Banking  
Company their successors and assigns to their own proper  
use benefit and behoof forever in fee simple upon condi-  
tion and it is expressly understood that should the said  
Rail Road contemplated as aforesaid be not located and  
established in and along said strip tract or parcel of  
land described in the above and foregoing indenture then  
said indenture is to be wholly null and void and of no
