Joseph Stevenson of the County & State aforesaid for & in
consideration of the sum of Two hundred & Seventy six
dollars to us in hand paid by Lemuel Dean of the
same place the receipt whereof we as hereby acknowl-
edge have granted bargained & sold & by these presents
do grant bargain & sell unto the said Lemuel Dean his
heirs and assigns the following property one Negro
girl called Livery about Nine years old dark com-
plexion which girl we warrant to be a slave for life
& healthy to have and to hold the aforesaid bargained
property to him the said Lemuel Dean his heirs &
assigns forever executors & administrators all & sin-
gular the said bargained property unto the said Lemuel
Dean his heirs & assigns against us & our said executors
and administrators & against all & every other person &
persons whatsoever shall & will warrant & defend by
these presents in Witness whereof we have hereunto
set our hands & affixed our seals & date this 19th of
March 1838 Signed Sealed & delivered in presence of
James H. Dawson Joseph Stevenson Esq
