

Georgia This Indenture Made this Month
of March County of January in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred forty four between
Reading Run of the County & State aforesaid of the one
part & George W Run of the same place Witnesseth
that the said Reading Run hath this day made and
acknowledged to the said George W Run his certain promissory
note Subscribed with his hand and bearing even date
with these presents whereby the said Reading Run hath
promised to pay the said George W Run or his heirs two
hundred dollars 18/100 cents the day after
the date for value received now for and in consideration
of the sum of five dollars the said George W Run to the
said Reading Run in hand paid the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged as for the better securing the
payment of the aforesaid promissory note the said Reading
Run hath granted bargained & sold & doth by these
presents grant bargain & sell unto the said George W
Run his heirs & assigns the following property viz
One Chestnut colored mare one bay horse there put
white with a blaze on his forehead one Sirel horse
colt one reddish dun colored cow one yearling
white dun colt one cow white & black specks one yearling
mostly black with some white hair in head of both hogs
four feathered birds of currituck to have & to hold the
said bargain property to the said George W Run his heirs &
assigns to his & them own proper use benefit & behoof
from the said Reading Run himself his heirs
executors & administrators the said bargain property unto
George W Run will warrant & forever defend against
the claim of himself & his heirs & against the claim
of all other persons whatever provided nevertheless
that if the said Reading Run his heirs executors & administrators
shall & do will & truly pay or cause to be paid
unto George W Run his heirs and assigns the sum of
one hundred dollars 18/100 cents to
on the day and time mentioned & appointed for the
payment thereof on the said promissory note with lawful
interest for the same according to the true value of said
note there tofrom thence forth as well this present
indenture & the right to the property thereby contained
as the said promissory note shall cease & determine & be void
to all intents & purposes in testimony whereof the said
Reading Run hath hereunto set his hand & seal the

I shall County I Alexander McWilliams of the County and
State of Georgia for me in consideration of the sum of five
dollars cash in hand paid at and for the sealing and delivery
of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
as well as for the better securing the payment of a certain
promissory note which the said Alexander McWilliams hath
his day made & delivered to Thomas H. Barnall of the same
place bearing the date with these presents and due one
day after date when by the said Alexander McWilliams promis-
ses to pay said Thomas H. Barnall or bearer sixteen dollars
one hundred cents for value received have bargained and sold
to the said Thos. H. Barnall the following property to wit a
certain barrel stave about seven years old four feet 8 or 10
inches high to have and to hold the aforesaid bargained prop-
erty to him the said Thos. H. Barnall his heirs and assigns forever
and to the said Alex. McWilliams for myself my heirs executors
and administrators the said bargaining property unto the said
Thomas H. Barnall his heirs and assigns against me my
executors and administrators and against all and every
other person or persons what so ever shall and will warrant
and defend by these presents. Provided further by
that if the said Alex. McWilliams his heirs executors and
administrators shall and do well and truly pay or cause
to be paid unto the said Thos. H. Barnall his heirs and assigns
the aforementioned sum of sixteen dollars & eighty cents on the
day mentioned and appointed for the payment thereof in said
promissory note mentioned with lawful interest for the same
according to the tenor of said note then and from thence forth as
well this Bill of Sale and the right to the property hereby
conveyed as the said Promissory note shall cease and determine and
be void to all intents and purposes. In testimony whereof
the said Alex. McWilliams hath hereunto set his hand and
affixed his seal this twenty fourth day of January 1844.
